The experts leading the training are specialists in the covered subjects. ASSESSMENT TERMS

The trainer evaluates each participant's academic progress throughout the training using multiple choice, scenarios, hands-on work and more. Participants also complete a placement test before and after the course to measure the skills they've developed.

TEACHING AIDS AND TECHNICAL RESOURCES

- The main teaching aids and instructional methods used in the training are audiovisual aids, documentation and course material, hands-on application exercises and corrected exercises for practical training courses, case studies and coverage of real cases for training seminars.
- At the end of each course or seminar, ORSYS provides participants with a course evaluation questionnaire that is analysed by our instructional teams.
- A check-in sheet for each half-day of attendance is provided at the end of the training, along with a course completion certificate if the trainee attended the entire session.

1 Ageing-related issues

- Distinguish between normal and pathological aging.
- Understand the anatomy, neurophysiology and psychology of aging.
- Identify loss of physical, cognitive and psychological skills and associated symptoms.
- Understanding the pathologies of aging: dementia, depression...

2 Understanding the legal context and users' rights related to ageing

- Practical application on the shop floor.
- Ethics and good treatment of the elderly.
- User rights and professional responsibilities concerning the elderly.

3 Relational care for the elderly

- Master the basics of communication.
- Practice active listening.
- Establish a relationship of trust.

Role-playing

Role-playing on cases presented by participants and capitalizing on best practices.

4 Coping with day-to-day difficulties

- Adapt your behavior to prevent potential difficulties for the elderly person.
- Experiencing difficulties in daily activities: getting up, getting dressed, eating, getting around...
- Identify the sensory impacts of aging: sight, smell, hearing, taste, touch.

Role-playing

Reproduce routine, everyday actions, taking into account the difficulties faced by people as they age.

5 Managing major geriatric syndromes

- Managing cases of undernutrition.
- Identify and manage depressive situations.
- Prevent falls.
- Support for medication monitoring.
- Promoting teamwork with the elderly.

Case study

Sub-group analysis of situations encountered and plenary debriefing.
