Participants will put their knowledge into practice by creating a task management application (ToDoList), and will be ready to tackle frameworks such as AngularJS or Node.js.

This online training course provides in-depth knowledge of React, enabling participants to exploit its full potential in front-end development. They will then discover Hooks, a key feature that enriches functional components. Each notion will be illustrated by concrete demonstrations.

This 1 hour 53-minute online training course teaches how to set up a client-side navigation system with React using the react-router library. After configuring the environment, participants will discover the essential components for creating links, managing redirects and organizing multiple pages. They will apply these notions to a concrete project, developing the navigation of a country consultation application via the restcountries.eu API.
